Hello Parents,

Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, **with thanksgiving**, make your requests known to God.

Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:6-7)

In Ann Voskamp's book, *One Thousand Gifts: A Dare to Live Fully Right Where You Are*, she accepts a challenge to make of list of 1,000 gifts or blessings in her life. The dare takes her on a journey of "eucharisteo," the Greek word for thanksgiving. She sets out to find something, even if quite small, to be thankful for in every situation and keeps a tally. Ann writes: "the practice of giving thanks...eucharisteo...this is the way we practice the presence of God, stay present to His presence, and it is always a practice of the eyes. We don't have to

change what we see. Only the way we see."

"Eucharisteo—thanksgiving—always precedes the miracle," says the author. Jesus gave thanks to His Father often. Even at the Last Supper, knowing full well the suffering that was to come, Jesus took the bread and gave thanks. And because of this gift, we are able to receive the Body of Christ in the Eucharist. Perhaps this Thanksgiving would be a good time to practice gratitude for all of Gods blessings in our own lives; especially the gift of the Eucharist.
